ANC 5C Monthly Meeting
7/20/10
Trinity University

- The meeting began with an introduction from Chairperson Bonds.
- Roll call was conducted and a quorum was established with ten (10) commissioners present at the time. Commissioners Bonds, Davenport, Salatti, Wright, Farmer-Allen, Daneker, Grant, Day, Edwards and Ransom were present. Commissioner Pinkney arrived after the roll call.
- The minutes from July were not approved. They will be approved at the monthly meeting in September 2010.
- Nancee Lyons from DPW announced information about Mural Projects for the Metropolitan Branch Trail.
- There was an announcement from Robert Brannum reminding the Commission as well as the community about the Hatch Act.
- Kathy Sutton from C.S.O.S.A. (Court Services and Offender Supervision Agency) spoke to the audience about the V.O.T.E.E. (Vocational Opportunities, Training, Education, Employment) program.
- Commissioner Bonds reviewed the action items from the June 2010 meeting.
- Commissioner Bonds gave an overview of the subcommittees within ANC 5C. Constituents were also encouraged to contact ANC 5C if interested in joining a committee.
- Commissioner Day gave the financial report for ANC 5C. Balances: \$84,944.25 in Savings and \$24,617.11 in Checking. The last deposit from the District came on 12/18/09 in the amount of \$7,564. The lack of additional allotments being disbursed is as a result of reporting issues with grants. ANC 5C is currently working to gather additional information from outstanding grantees to come in good standing with the District's auditors.
- Commissioner Daneker motioned to pass the financial report. Commissioner Edwards offered a second to that motion. The motion passed 8-0-1 with Commissioner Ransom abstaining.
- Commissioner Day asked if a representative from the United Youth Athletic Club was available to present their grant application. No representative came forth.
- T Street Restoration Committee - This group submitted a grant application. The application amount was over the \$5,000 limit and the application needs to be altered before the next meeting.

- ANC 5C Guide on Restaurants and Liquor Licenses. Commissioner Bonds briefly reviewed the document for the audience. Commissioner Daneker motioned to approve the guide. Commissioner Farmer-Allen offered a second to the motion. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 10-0.
- Metropolitan Branch Trail – An information sharing presentation about upcoming plans took place.
- Fire House (EC12) Liquor License Application – The applicant is looking for a liquor license approval at the next meeting. Zoning and seating updates are noted within the application document. The applicant will meet with the Eckington Civic Association on 8/2/10. Construction will take six (6) months. Robert Brannum noted that ANC 5C voted in support of the project in 2002.
- Big Bear Liquor License Application – There was an extended period given to community comments. Citizens who supported as well as those who opposed were given an opportunity to comment. After the community comment period, Commissioner Daneker motioned to end debate. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 10-0. Commissioner Daneker then motioned to adopt a resolution of opposition of Big Bear Café's Liquor License Application. Commissioner Farmer-Allen offered a second to that motion. The motion passed unanimously with a vote of 9-0. It is also noted that Commissioner Davenport recused himself from the vote.
- The meeting was adjourned.
